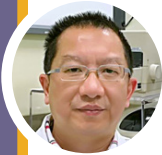

The Tear of the Right Diaphragm was the Hidden Culprit of Bleeding in an Elderly Hemophilic Traffic Accident Passenger

Qirong Du, MD

Injuries to elderly hemophilic passengers caused by road traffic accidents need to be carefully evaluated, especially when the extent of rib fractures and ischial rami of pelvis cannot be matched with the degree of blood loss despite of fluid resuscitation and supplementation of clotting factors, it is still necessary to consider

the mechanism of injury and repeatedly re-evaluate when right hemothorax can't be fully explained. Single right-sided diaphragmatic rupture is relatively rare and can cause shock because of its severity and several factors leading to hypovolemia. The diagnosis of 10-50% of patients may be delayed for several days or weeks. Patients with delayed treatment may have dyspnea, progressive anemia, and mediastinal displacement. Once diagnosed, the only treatment for diaphragmatic rupture is surgery.

The spectrum of damage control resuscitation starts from the prehospital phase, continues in the emergency room and in selected cases gets to the operating room and the intensive care unit. The prehospital providers are often so busy in this delicate balance, that deliberate actions that will help shorten time to the operating room may be overlooked. It is important for the prehospital providers to recognize those patients who would require damage control surgery as the next step, in order to take some preparatory actions in addition to their resuscitative efforts. These actions will reduce unnecessary delays and if possible 'bypass' the emergency room. This discussion is a reminder of the principles of damage control surgery, with emphasis on early recognition of this subset of patients to help informed decision even in the absence of medical direction in some climes.

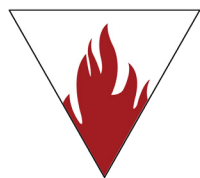
